




You decide everything from the exterior style to the interior traffic flow. You create the living space of your dreams.






make changes as they create the plan for your home. However, you should ask yourself some key questions as well. How many bedrooms

do you want? Do you have special needs such as accommodating elderly parents? Do you want your kitchen open to surrounding rooms? Will the








CHOOSING AN INTERIOR DESIGNER






new room. Just as important, they can guide you away from mistakes.


or designers who have a good grasp of custom building and understand our specific processes.

CHOOSING YOUR LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT

Equally important to the design build team is your landscape architect. How the home's exterior looks and feels depends to a large extent upon its surroundings. 
grading, placements of walkways, driveways and patios. They will also suggest seeding and sodding plans, plantings for the property, outdoor lighting, sprinkler systems, etc.
